## VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION PROGRAM STATISTICS JUNE, 2012

Ohio's Voluntary Exclusion Program (VEP) is a program that allows an individual to ban themselves from the casinos for a period of one year, five years, or lifetime. While not designed to be the solution to an individual's gambling problem, it is one more tool available to them on their journey to recovery.

As of June 18, 2012, the Ohio Casino Control Commission has accepted 27 applications from 2 states for the voluntary exclusion program. Below are some of the demographic statistics to date.
