**ORDER DENYING CASINO GAMING EMPLOYEE LICENSE RENEWAL
APPLICATION**

On January 17, 2019, Dontel Wilder filed a Casino Gaming Employee License Renewal Application (“Application”) with the Ohio Casino Control Commission (“Commission”). Thereafter, the Commission conducted a suitability investigation of Wilder to determine his eligibility for such a license.

During the investigation, the Commission discovered sufficient derogatory information to warrant issuance of an Emergency Order suspending Wilder’s current Casino Gaming Employee License, and a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing (“Notice”) denying Wilder’s Application, dated December 17, 2019. The Emergency Order and Notice were received by Wilder, via personal service, on December 17, 2019.

Pursuant to R.C. 119.07 and 3772.04, Wilder had the right to a hearing regarding both the Emergency Order and the Notice if requested within 30 days of service. Wilder failed to do so. Accordingly, no hearing was held, the Emergency Order stands, and the Notice was brought before the Commission on February 19, 2020, for final adjudication. R.C. 119.07 and 3772.04(A).

WHEREFORE, the Commission **FINDS** and **CONCLUDES** as follows:


Wilder failed to establish his suitability for licensure by clear and convincing evidence, as required by R.C. 3772.10 or Ohio Adm.Code 3772-8-05, for the reasons set forth in the Notice.

WHEREFORE, the Commission **ORDERS** as follows:

- 1) Wilder’s Application is **DENIED**.
- 2) Wilder is **PROHIBITED** from working or otherwise serving in any capacity that requires a license under R.C. Chapter 3772.
- 3) Wilder is **PROHIBITED** from reapplying for licensure under R.C. Chapter 3772 for three years from the date the Order is served upon him, absent a waiver granted by the Commission commensurate with Ohio Adm.Code 3772-1-04.

- 4) A certified copy of the Order shall be served upon Wilder, via certified mail, return receipt requested, and his counsel of record, if any, via ordinary mail.

IT IS SO ORDERED.

NOTICE OF APPEAL RIGHTS

The Party is hereby notified that pursuant to R.C. 119.12, the Commission Order may be appealed by filing a Notice of Appeal with the Commission setting forth the Order that the Party is appealing from and stating that the Commission's Order is not supported by reliable, probative, and substantial evidence and is not in accordance with law. The Notice of Appeal may also include, but is not required to include, the specific grounds for the appeal. The Notice of Appeal must also be filed with the Franklin County Court of Common Pleas in accordance with R.C. 119.12. In filing the Notice of Appeal with the Commission or Court, the filing may be either the original Notice of Appeal or a copy thereof. The Notice of Appeal must be filed within 15 days after the date of mailing of the Commission Order.
