Hollywood Casino Columbus Fined for Compliance Violations

*Casino Failed to Properly Store Table Game Cards, Operated Games in a Manner
Inconsistent With Its Internal Controls and Game Rules*

COLUMBUS – The Ohio Casino Control Commission today voted to accept a settlement agreement with Hollywood Casino Columbus regarding compliance violations involving the operation of table games and the storage of table game cards. The agreement includes a \$95,000 fine.

The Commission’s Regulatory Compliance Division discovered Hollywood Columbus operated table games in a manner inconsistent with Commission-approved game rules and failed to store table game cards as required by the Ohio Administrative Code. Additionally, the Commission found issues with the casino’s maintenance of its electronic shuffler inventory.

“The Commission is vigilant in its efforts to ensure Ohio’s casinos are in compliance with all gaming-related laws and rules, and we will not hesitate to take administrative action when necessary in order to maintain the integrity of casino gaming in Ohio,” said June Taylor, Chair of the Ohio Casino Control Commission.

Hollywood Columbus is also required to demonstrate to the Commission that its employees are trained in all laws, policies and procedures and Commission-approved internal controls as part of the settlement agreement.

All fines levied by the Commission are deposited into the State’s General Revenue Fund.

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The Ohio Casino Control Commission is the regulatory body with oversight of the state’s four casinos.
